

# OPEN LETTER IN SUPPORT OF GLASSWORKS SUNDERLAND

## SUBJECT:

Public Statement of Support from Glassmakers and Ceramicists for the Development of Glassworks Sunderland

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We, the undersigned glassmakers and ceramicists working in Sunderland, across the wider UK and internationally, write to state our collective support for the development of Glassworks Sunderland, proposed for the former Peter Smith Antiques site in Sunnyside.

This letter is intended as a clear and constructive statement of professional confidence in the project and in the process currently being led by Sunderland Culture to develop a full business case for submission to central government via DCMS. We understand that provisional funding of £5 million is contingent upon the successful completion of this business case by March 2026.

## CONTEXT

The closure of the National Glass Centre after 28 years of internationally recognised work in glass art, education, exhibition, outreach, and public engagement is deeply regrettable. Equally significant is the scheduled closure in 2026 of the BA, MA, and PhD programmes in Glass and Ceramics at the University of Sunderland, ending more than four decades of continuous, high-level specialist education.

The achievements of glass and ceramics staff and graduates, many of whom now work internationally, are evident in The Graduates, the final exhibition opening at the National Glass Centre on 30 January. Faculty and NGC staff have played a significant role in establishing Sunderland's international standing through externally facing initiatives such as the Glass Exchange programme and partnerships with organisations including the V&A, Sorrel Foundation and Tradecraft. Together, these activities have positioned Sunderland as a centre for cultural production, skills exchange, and applied research. The contribution of these programmes to British studio glass and ceramics and to the cultural life, civic identity, and heritage of the city cannot be overstated.

We recognise that the University's decision reflects a wider national trend of higher education institutions withdrawing from arts, design, and heritage craft provision. While we do not support this direction, we acknowledge the broader context in which it has occurred.

## POSITION OF THE UNDERSIGNED

We acknowledge the efforts of the Campaign to Save the National Glass Centre and their commitment to preventing the loss of an important cultural building. However, we differ from the campaign on a fundamental issue.

As professional glassmakers, educators, technicians, and practitioners with over 4000 years of combined experience, we believe that the primary asset at risk is not a building, but the continuation of glassmaking itself: the skills, knowledge, passionate people, and professional ecology that sustain the practice and its community of makers.

Glassmaking in Sunderland has a documented lineage of over 1,350 years, during which it has existed in

many different buildings, workshops, and industrial contexts. The history of glass in this city has never been defined by a single structure. It has been defined by passionate practice, resilience, adaptability, endeavour, experimentation, and transmission of skills.

From our considered and professional standpoint, the continuation of glassmaking in Sunderland is of greater long-term cultural value than the preservation of a building.

### **SUPPORT FOR GLASSWORKS SUNDERLAND**

For this reason, we fully support the development of Glassworks Sunderland as proposed by Sunderland Culture.

We regard this project as the clearest and most realistic opportunity to:

- retain and develop glassmaking skills within the city
- provide viable production, teaching, and public engagement facilities
- support professional artists, early-career makers, and community access
- retain and grow Sunderland's international reputation as a centre of excellence for glass
- safeguard heritage through active practice rather than passive preservation

Concerns have been raised publicly regarding whether the proposed Sunnyside site, formerly Peter Smith Antiques, is "fit for purpose." Assertions that the proposed site is inherently unworkable are not supported by professional evidence or consultation with those who operate such facilities. Glassmakers are, by necessity, resourceful, technically literate, and highly experienced in adapting industrial and commercial buildings for safe, efficient, and creative use. As practitioners, many of us have been directly involved in establishing studios from the ground up across the UK and internationally; we believe that glassmakers themselves are best placed to make informed judgements about functional suitability.

### **A CLEAR RISK**

We are concerned that continued public messaging which characterises the proposed facility as inadequate, risks undermining political and financial confidence in the entire project.

If the current opportunity is lost due to divided public optics, Sunderland faces a genuine risk of moving from a viable, ambitious future for glassmaking to no provision at all.

From our perspective, this would represent the greatest possible loss.

### **CONCLUSION**

We the undersigned therefore state publicly and unequivocally that we:

- support the development of the Glassworks Sunderland business case
- believe the project represents the best available route to sustaining glassmaking in the city
- urge Sunderland City Council, Sunderland Culture, DCMS, and all stakeholders to proceed with confidence
- stand ready, as practitioners, passionate makers, and supportive partners, to contribute our expertise to ensuring the project's success

Glassmaking in Sunderland has survived for more than a millennium through change, adaptation, and reinvention. With institutional and civic support, the future of glassmaking in Sunderland can thrive.
